Addressing the Risk of Climate Change

ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Sherri K. Stuewer is Vice President - Safety, Health and Environment for Exxon Mobil Corporation. In this role she is responsible for developing, reviewing, and coordinating ExxonMobil's worldwide efforts in the environment, safety, and health areas. Prior to her current assignment, Stuewer was strategic planning manager for ExxonMobil, general manager of the Exxon Company U.S.A. supply department, and manager of the Exxon refinery in Baytown, Texas. Over her 30-year career with ExxonMobil, she has held a variety of technical and managerial positions in refining, planning, and logistics.

Stuewer is a member of the Board of Trustees and the Engineering College Council at Cornell University. She is also a board member of the YMCA of Metropolitan Dallas and the Bermuda Institute of Ocean Sciences. She is a past chair of the Industry Advisory Board to the International Energy Agency.

Stuewer holds a B.S. and M.S. in Engineering from Cornell University. She is married and has two daughters.

SYNOPSIS

Governments, communities and individuals around the world are concerned about the rise in greenhouse gas emissions and the risk of climate change. Given the link between energy use, living standards and greenhouse gas emissions, it is vital that there is open and constructive dialogue. The desire of people in the developing world for a better quality of life will be the key driver of global energy demand growth over the next few decades. At the same time, the developed world will need increased supplies of energy to maintain and enhance living standards. This growth in demand for energy, including the burning of fossil fuels, will contribute to an increase in global greenhouse gas emissions.

Sherri Stuewer, Vice President for Safety Health and Environment at Exxon Mobil Corporation will share ExxonMobil's thoughts and perspectives on these important issues, including ExxonMobil's perspective on the outlook for energy use; the implications of energy use for greenhouse gas emissions; the risk of climate change; considerations of policy options to address these risks; and action ExxonMobil is taking to address climate risk.
